


Learning or Earning Laws

- Gain a Certificate III Qualification or
- Turn 17, whichever comes first

Curriculum Opportunities

- Study 6 subjects
- School Based Traineeships/Apprenticeships available on application
- TAFE courses available on application
- Virtual School offerings
- Timetable and offerings are developed from student choices, but are constrained by student numbers and available teaching and physical resources



Types of Subjects: Authority, Authority Registered subjects

Authority Subject

Authority subjects are based on syllabuses that have been approved and issued by the QCAA. Results in Authority subjects can count in the calculation of an Overall Position (OP).

Authority Registered Subject

Authority-registered subjects are developed from Study Area Specifications (SASs) and generally include substantial vocational and practical components. Results in these subjects are not used in the calculation of OPs.



Stand-alone Vocational Education & Training (VET) Subject

- Cav Rd offers VET at Certificate II and III levels
- Referred to as stand alone VET subjects because they are not considered a part of the standard syllabus
- They still contribute towards QCE credit and are used in the calculation of a RANK.

Virtual Schooling - BSDE or QCAA

- Unable to undertake subjects that cannot be offered at Cav Rd due to insufficient enrolments or timetable clashes
- A dedicated room and bank of computers that utilise an Internet hook-up (voice and data) for interactive lessons with qualified teachers
- Students completing subjects through Virtual schooling need to be able to work independently as lessons are not conducted in a formal classroom setting.



What are OPs?

- An OP is a student's state-wide rank based on overall achievement in QCAA approved subjects.
- It indicates how well the student has done in comparison to all other OP-eligible students in Queensland.
- Students are placed in one of 25 OP bands from 1 (highest) to 25 (lowest).

Eligibility for OP

- Must study 20 semester units of <u>Authority subjects</u>,
- At least three subjects for four semesters each, and must sit the QCS Test.

What is a Selection Rank?

- Non OP can still gain entry to courses offered at tertiary institutions
- Issued with a Rank from QTAC



Senior Education Training Plan SET P Explanation

- HODs/Teachers will provide feedback on suitability of initial subject choices.
- Final SET Plan and subject selections by Friday 28 August
- Some subjects may not be able to be offered due to numbers
- Some students may need to re-select subjects
- Registration of Learning Intentions in Learning Account
- Issuing of Learning Account ID (LUI) and Password




Subject Selection Considerations

- Consider your interests, knowledge & skills
- Decide whether OP or non-OP bound
- Authority (OP) subjects, Authority Registered subjects
- Vocational Opportunities via TAFE studies or Skills Tech
- Choices based on future career pathway requirements, abilities and interests
- Pre-requisite to senior subjects should be considered – physical & life sciences

Responsibilities of a Senior Student
